GENERAL NARRATIVE.

On 26 March 1945, the period covered by this report, this ship was a unit of the Cruiser Covering Group assigned the general task of providing cover and support for the amphibious landings by the Americal Infantry Division at TALISAY, Cebu Island. This ship participated only in the prearranged bombardment which preceded the landings.

- B. This ship departed from SUBIC BAY in company with Task Group 74.3 on the morning of 24 March. The trip to the objective was uneventful. The Reserve Covering Unit was detached during the afternoon of 26 March and proceeded to MANGARIN BAY, Mindoro.
- C. The mission of this ship was to provide scheduled shore bombardment and cover for minesweepers working in the channels. Little or no resistance was anticipated from enemy air or surface forces.

- D. Ships of this group took assigned stations 2000 to 3000 yards to the Southward of the landing beaches. On completion of bombardment this ship screened to seaward of the HOBART for the rest of the day.

- 0537 Directed by Commander Task Group 74.3 to proceed independently and cover minesweeping unit.
 - 0615 Lying to in BOHOL STRAITS covering Minesweeps.
 - 0618 Manned Battle Stations preparatory to bombardment.
 - 0703 Cruisers commenced bombardment.
 - 0704 Proceeded to assigned fire support station.
 - 0728 Lying to on Station 1500 yards due South of LAGUNDI SHOAL.
 - 0745 Commenced scheduled bombardment at targets in and behind the town of TALISAY.
 - 0825 Ceased firing. Ammunition expended: 705 rounds of 5"/38 Cal. AA Common.
 - 0830 The 132nd and 182nd Regiments of the Americal Infantry Division landed on Green Beach near TALISAY.
- 0843 Relieved as fire support ship by SMITH (DD378) and proceeded to screen HMAS HOBART. Patrolled for rest of day to seaward.
 - 0850 Set Condition II.
- 1635 Reported to CTG 78.2 for duty.
 - 1728 Took station in screen of Night Retirement Group.
 - 1900 Designated as OTC of first returning echelon. Formed group consisting of amphibious craft and departed for LEYTE.

ORDNANCE.

- A. PERFORMANCE OF OWN ORDNANCE MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT.
 - 1. Ship's gunnery.
 - a. Ammunition expended, by caliber and type:

4 - Septing 1,200, 400 - 5"/38 Cal. AA Common - 705 rounds.

Some services and Three hundred eighty-four (384) of these projectiles were fuzed with Mk. 29 Mod. 3 fuzes, 139 with steel nose plug and the balance with Mk. 18 Mod. 3 fuze.

- Direct fire was used with range and deflection spots applied to provide the area coverage desired. Parallax was kept on "zero" in the mounts to increase deflection pattern.
- c. As several ships were firing into the same area at the same time, it was not possible to accurately evaluate the results of firing.
 - A critical situation existed in the upper handling room of gun three due to the presence in the air of large quantities of asbestos dust, which was dislodged from the insulation of the engine room exhaust trunk by the shock of gunfire. The projectile hoist stopped several times because of the accumulation of asbestos dust in the hoist mechanism. Personnel were able to breathe only with great difficulty during the entire period of the bombardment. An alteration has been approved to replace the metal sheathing with fibre glass. The experience of this ship indicates the urgency of such an alteration.
